

Catalina Camia anchors the On Politics blog for USA TODAY, providing breaking news and analysis on national politics and Congress. She previously was an assignment editor for USA TODAY, overseeing reporters who cover the White House, national politics and Congress. She co-directed coverage of the 2008 presidential campaign and the 2006 and 2010 congressional elections, including the newspaper's coverage of the influence of campaign money and lobbying.

She joined USA TODAY in 2005, after a stint as a Washington editor for the Gannett Washington Bureau, formerly known as Gannett News Service. At Gannett, Catalina supervised correspondents covering Washington, D.C. for nine states.

Catalina has focused on politics and government in her 25-year journalism career. As a Washington correspondent for The Dallas Morning News from 1995-2000, she covered Congress and wrote a weekly column about Texas lawmakers.

She also reported in Texas for The Dallas Morning News and the Dallas Times Herald, and in the nation's capital for Congressional Quarterly Weekly Report.

Catalina is a former national president of the Asian American Journalists Association and a former president of UNITY: Journalists of Color. She presided over the coalition of black, Hispanic, Asian and Native American journalists' organizations during its historic 1999 convention in Seattle.

Catalina graduated from the University of Southern California and attended the Maynard Institute's Management Training Center at Northwestern University. She has been recognized for her contributions to journalism by Filipinas magazine and named a "journalist to watch" by Washingtonian magazine.
