## Senator Brian Schatz

U.S. Senate, Hawai'i

Senator Schatz chairs the Indian Affairs Committee, and serves on the Appropriations Committee; the Commerce, Science, and Transportation Committee; the Foreign Relations Committee; and the Select Committee on Ethics. He also serves on the Senate Democratic Caucus's leadership team as Chief Deputy Whip. Prior to his service in Congress, Senator Schatz was Hawai'i's Lieutenant Governor and served for eight years in the Hawai'i State House of Representatives.

## Congresswoman Doris Matsui

U.S. House of Representatives, CA-6

Since 2005, Congresswoman Matsui has represented the 6th District of California encompassing the city of Sacramento and the surrounding areas. As a senior member of the House Energy and Commerce Committee, she serves on the Health, Environment and Climate Change, and Consumer Protection and Commerce subcommittees and is the Vice Chair on the Communications and Technology subcommittee. As the co-chair of the bipartisan Congressional High Tech Caucus, she advocates for policies to expand the innovative use of technology across every sector of the economy. She also is an ardent supporter of advancing STEM education, especially for women and girls.

## Congressman Jerry McNerney

U.S. House of Representatives, CA-9

Congressman Jerry McNerney was sworn into office on January 4, 2007. He is proud to represent California's 9th District, which includes a large portion of San Joaquin County in the Central Valley as well as parts of Contra Costa and Sacramento Counties. McNerney was inspired to run for Congress by his son Michael, who in response to the attacks of September 11, sought and received a commission in the Air Force. Michael suggested that his Dad serve his country by running for Congress. With a deep sense of duty and his family's support, McNerney began his journey to Congress. Congressman McNerney is honored to serve on the Committee on Energy and Commerce, the oldest standing legislative committee in the U.S. House of Representatives. The committee is vested with broad jurisdiction on a number of issues including telecommunications, consumer protection, food and drug safety, public health research, environmental quality, energy policy, and interstate and foreign commerce. The Congressman is also proud to be a member of the House Committee on Science, Space and Technology. McNerney, who has his Ph.D. in mathematics, served several years as an engineering contractor to Sandia National Laboratories in New Mexico. In 1990 McNerney moved with his family to California, accepting a senior engineering position with U.S. Windpower, Kenetech. McNerney later began working as an energy consultant for PG&E, FloWind, the Electric Power Research Institute, and other utility companies. Prior to his election to Congress, he formed a start-up company to manufacture wind turbines. During his career in wind energy, McNerney's work contributed to saving the equivalent of approximately 30 million barrels of oil, or 8.3 million tons of carbon dioxide.



## Congressman Marc Veasey

U.S. House of Representatives, TX-33

Rep. Veasey is an advocate for Texas' middle-class families and is committed to creating jobs, improving public education, fighting for immigration reform, and ensuring access to quality healthcare and women's reproductive rights. Congressman Veasey was appointed in the 117th Congress to serve on the Committee on Energy and Commerce and House Armed Services Committee. Prior to his committee appointments, Rep. Veasey served on the Small Business Committee and the Committee on Science Space and Technology. Throughout his time in Congress, Rep. Veasey founded the first Congressional Voting Rights Caucus to address the immediate need to eliminate the barriers and discrimination too many Americans face at the polls. In the 117th Congress, he accepted his appointment as an Assistant and Regional Whip. In the 117th Congress, the Congressman was appointed to serve as a Whip for the Gun Violence Prevention Taskforce. Rep. Veasey is currently a member of the U.S. Helsinki Commission, Congressional Black Caucus and the New Democrat Coalition. He also co-launched the Blue Collar Caucus with Congressman Brendan Boyle to find solutions to problems too many middle-class Americans are facing. The Blue Collar Caucus supports unions and focuses on addressing wage stagnation, offshoring, and job insecurity for those in the manufacturing and building trades. First elected to the Texas State House in 2004, Congressman Veasey represented District 95 – an area now part of the 33rd Congressional District. As a member of the Texas State House, Rep. Veasey served in a number of leadership positions including Democratic Whip and Chair of the Democratic Caucus. Issues he championed included fighting for affordable healthcare, funding for better schools, and advocating for a livable wage. Prior to serving four terms in the Texas House of Representatives, Rep. Veasey worked as a congressional staffer in North Texas for Congressman Martin Frost.



## Congresswoman Debbie Dingell

U.S. House of Representatives, MI-12

Congresswoman Dingell represents Michigan's 12th Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives and serves in House Leadership as a Co-chair of the Democratic Policy and Communications Committee. She is a member of the Energy and Commerce Committee and the Natural Resources Committee, where she leads on critical issues including affordable and accessible health care, clean energy and water, domestic manufacturing and supply chain resilience, and protecting our wildlife and natural resources. Growing up in Michigan, Dingell, who chairs the Great Lakes Task Force, has always been an advocate for the outdoors and commits her work in Congress to protecting the environment for generations. In 2021, she worked together with the White House, the auto industry, the auto workers, and environmentalists to announce the Biden Administration's goal of having 50% of new vehicles sold in 2030 be zero-emissions vehicles.



## Congressman Jimmy Gomez

U.S. House of Representatives, CA-34

Congressman Jimmy Gomez proudly represents California's 34th Congressional District, one of the most diverse and culturally rich districts in the country. In the 117th Congress, he serves as Vice Chair of the House Committee on Oversight and Reform, sits on the powerful House Committee on Ways and Means, and serves as an Assistant Whip for the House Democratic Caucus. Congressman Gomez is also a member of the Congressional Hispanic Caucus (CHC), Congressional Asian Pacific American Caucus (CAPAC), Congressional Progressive Caucus (CPC), and Future Forum. Prior to his election to Congress in June of 2017, Congressman Gomez served four and a half years in the California State Assembly where he served as Chair of the Assembly Appropriations Committee. In the Assembly, Congressman Gomez distinguished himself as a proven national champion of paid family leave and combatting climate change. He became a key figure in authoring landmark legislation to address public health, environmental justice, water conservation, access to education, civic engagement, campaign finance disclosure, LGBTQ rights, and affordable housing. Congressman Gomez attended Riverside Community College before receiving a B.A. in Political Science from the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA), and a M.A. in Public Policy from Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. He lives in Eagle Rock with his wife, Mary, and dog, Austin. He is a lifelong fan of the Los Angeles Dodgers.

## Dr. Vanessa Z. Chan

Chief Commercialization Officer, Director of Office of Technology Transitions,  
U.S. Department of Energy

Dr. Vanessa Z. Chan is the Chief Commercialization Officer for the Department of Energy and Director of the Office of Technology Transitions. In this role she is responsible for all commercialization activities across DOE, the 17 National Laboratories, and the Department's other research and production facilities across the country. She is an innovator who has worked across a wide range of ecosystems, from academia to Fortune 1000 companies to startups. She has two decades of experience helping organizations grow at the interface of technology and business, across a diverse set of industries. Chan is currently on a leave of absence from her position as Undergraduate Chair of the Materials Science & Engineering department and the Jonathan and Linda Brassington Professor of Practice in Innovation & Entrepreneurship at the University of Pennsylvania's School of Engineering and Applied Sciences. At Penn she was redesigning how engineers are being educated by formally incorporating real world skills (understanding of supply chains & ecosystems, presentation skills, etc.) to better prepare her students to have an impact when they graduate. She is a former McKinsey & Company partner, experienced Venture Board Director for Vanguard and United Technology Corporation, and a board member at multiple startups. Chan was the first woman and the first East Asian elected partner in McKinsey's North American Chemicals practice. She is a nationally respected educator who is the first Practice Professor at Penn's School of Engineering and Applied Sciences, awarded an endowed scholarly chair.



## Christine Harada

Executive Director, Federal Permitting Improvement Steering Council (FPISC)

Christine Harada serves as the Executive Director of the Permitting Council. As Executive Director, Harada assists Permitting Council member agencies in managing a portfolio of nearly \$100 billion in large-scale infrastructure projects—most of which are renewable energy, coastal restoration, and electricity transmission projects. She assists Federal agencies in developing and implementing comprehensive, project-specific timetables for all required infrastructure permitting reviews and authorizations for FAST-41 covered infrastructure projects, advancing the administration's infrastructure agenda to rebuild the economy.

Harada brings more than 25 years of leadership experience in the public and private sectors to the Permitting Council. Harada was most recently the Vice President for Government Affairs at Heliogen, a California-based renewable energy technology company. Previously, she served as the President of i(x) investments, a company focused on impact-driven investments in critical areas such as renewable energy, green real estate development, and accessible smart and sustainable housing. She was a Partner with Ridge-Lane Limited Partners, an advisory firm of experts in private sector innovation, investment capital, and government policy that works with companies pursuing social and environmental impact, along with financial performance.

As the former Federal Chief Sustainability Officer under President Barack Obama, Harada oversaw all federal sustainability-related initiatives in energy, vehicle fleets, and acquisitions. She also served as the Acting Chief of Staff, the Associate Administrator of Government-wide Policy, and Chief Acquisition Officer at the U.S. General Services Administration.

Harada has worked as a Senior Systems Engineer at Lockheed Martin and as a consultant at the Boston Consulting Group and Booz Allen Hamilton. She holds a master's degree in international studies from the University of Pennsylvania (Penn) and an MBA in finance from the Wharton School at Penn. Additionally, she has a master's degree from Stanford University and a bachelor's degree from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in aeronautics and astronautics.

### Caroline Choi

Senior Vice President of Corporate Affairs, Edison International

Caroline Choi is senior vice president of Corporate Affairs at Southern California Edison and its parent company, Edison International. Choi oversees Corporate Communications, Corporate Philanthropy, Government Relations and Public Affairs at the national, state and local levels. Choi is active in national policy and community engagement. She serves on the board of SEPA, a nationwide organization that supports the implementation and deployment of clean energy and distributed resources. She also chairs the board of Veloz, a nonprofit dedicated to accelerating the shift to electric transportation through public-private collaboration and public engagement.



### Deron Lovaas

Senior Policy Analyst, People and Communities program, NRDC

For 20 years, Deron Lovaas has closely monitored public policies pertaining to the built environment. He oversees advocacy for efforts related to energy efficiency, housing, smart growth, and transportation. He previously served as NRDC's director of federal transportation policy, as well as chief strategist for advancing bipartisan oil-savings legislation and renewing the nation's transportation law. Before joining NRDC, Lovaas worked for several conservation groups, including the National Wildlife Federation, Zero Population Growth, and the Sierra Club. From 1993 to 1995, he served as an environmental specialist with Maryland's Department of the Environment.



### T. Bruce Tsuchida (Moderator)

Principal, The Brattle Group

Mr. T. Bruce Tsuchida is a Principal of The Brattle Group with over thirty years of experience in domestic and international power generation development, utility operation, and power market analysis. He specializes in bridging technology, economics, and regulatory policy, particularly in assessing the impact of new technologies and regulatory changes. This includes analysis of evolving wholesale electric markets and modeling, impact of renewable and other new technologies' on system operations, utility business, and various impacts on valuations of transmission, generation, and distribution assets, deliverability, and contracts. He has evaluated various utility business model options associated with the change in markets (structural changes through deregulation and landscape changes such as increase in renewables). These studies range from large interconnected systems to small island system, several with testimonies and/or affidavits filed.

He is well versed in offshore wind through his experience in the development and early permitting activities for Coastal Virginia Offshore Wind (CVOW) Pilot Project. Currently, a large part of his time is spent on Dominion Energy's Business to Business, Workforce Development and Community Outreach activity for as the Company moves forward implementing the requirements of the Virginia Clean Economy Act, including the 16,100 MW of solar, 5,200 MW of offshore wind and 2,700 MW of storage, with the objective of maximising opportunities for Virginia's vendors, subcontractors, and suppliers.

### Jasper Jung

### David Quinalty

David joined Waymo after twelve and a half years working in the U.S. Senate -- including as Deputy Staff Director of the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation, which has jurisdiction over self-driving vehicles. During his time in the Senate, most recently as the committee's Policy Director for Communications and Technology, he worked extensively on issues where new technologies intersect with regulated industries.



### David S. Kim (Moderator)

Senior Vice President and Principal, National Transportation Policy and Multimodal Strategy, WSP USA

David S. Kim is a transportation executive with WSP USA, a global engineering and professional services firm. He is based in the company's Washington, D.C. office. He guides policymaking that supports federal funding for transportation projects anticipated under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law enacted in November 2021. He also guides the delivery of transportation capital projects, including strategic planning and policy, environmental process, funding and finance and capital delivery. Prior to joining WSP, David served as Secretary of the California State Transportation Agency (CalSTA). A longtime transportation leader with experience in the private sector as well as all three levels of government, David was Vice President, Government Affairs for Hyundai Motor Company from 2017-2019. Prior to this assignment, David spent nearly eight years in senior level roles at the U.S. Department of Transportation. He served as Deputy Administrator of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the number two position in the agency.

### Bob Gee

Robert W. Gee is President of Gee Strategies Group LLC, a Washington, D.C.-based consulting firm excelling in policy analysis, advocacy, and litigation support for a variety of domestic and foreign clients in the energy and utility sectors. A 40-year veteran of the energy industry, his thought leadership is exemplified by his diverse experience as an attorney, senior state and federal official, and technology executive. A native Texan, his public sector energy experience began in Washington as a Trial Attorney at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). He served as Commissioner and Chairman of the Public Utility Commission of Texas and as Chairman of the Electricity Committee at the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners. He returned to Washington as Assistant Secretary for Policy and International Affairs and for Fossil Energy at the US Department of Energy. He currently serves as President of Asian Americans in Energy, the Environment, and Commerce, and as member of the Board of the Northeast-Midwest Institute.

Jerry Griffin is a member of Delta's Global Sustainability team overseeing the development and execution of the company's sustainability agenda. ### **Emilie Ikeda (Moderator)**

News Correspondent, NBC News

Emilie Ikeda is an NBC News Correspondent based in New York. She reports for all the network's platforms, including "TODAY," "NBC Nightly News with Lester Holt," NBC News NOW, NBC News Daily and MSNBC. Since joining NBC News in July 2021, Ikeda's reporting has carried her from coast to coast – from a massive oil spill in California to flooding in Washington, a truck driver shortage in Mississippi and a racially-motivated supermarket shooting in New York. She had the rare opportunity to shadow an elite firefighting crew, referred to as the "hotshots," as they scaled the Sierra Nevada Mountains, battling a relentless blaze. You will frequently find Ikeda covering business news and breaking down what the developments mean for American families, reporting on the tumultuous housing market, baby formula shortage, decades-high inflation and the Federal Reserve's aggressive interest rate hikes. Previously, Ikeda worked as an MMJ/reporter and fill-in anchor at FOX 5 Atlanta, as well as a multimedia reporter for Fox News. During her tenure there, she covered deadly hurricanes and tornadoes, actor Bill Cosby's retrial, Congressman John Lewis' death and numerous mass killings, including the Parkland school shooting and Pittsburgh synagogue massacre. Ikeda studied broadcast journalism and political science, graduating magna cum laude from American University's Honors College. She also minored in dance and was captain of the school's Division I field hockey team.
